



Concludes Old MacDonald didn't have farm, wasn't 'old!



# "Get a Long little Doggie" contest cancelled




Protesters argued it was inhumane of Long to mail the puppies to winners.




than two. Plus it'll cut down on costs whenever I have something engraved." The WCCO Radio research department found that the Hertsgaard name was originally
